The curriculum

- As a maintained school we follow the National Curriculum.
- Children in both Key Stages are taught all subjects including music, art, Design Technology, French and computing.
- We are proud of our sporting offer which includes one and a half hours of National Curriculum PE per week as well as the same amount of 'competitive sports' where the whole year group plays football, netball, cricket, rounders and other field and invasion games. All pupils from this year on will have Forest school within Competitive Sports.
- We teach PSE/RSE on a weekly basis as well as a 'safe and sound' curriculum of 'drop-ins'.

Extra-curricular opportunities

- We have a varied programme of lunchtime and after school clubs.
- We offer residential visits in each year group which build up in terms of length of time and distance away. This year, we have:
