A LETTER FROM OUR HEADTEACHER Mrs Taylor-Potts

Dear Parent/Carer

It's been a long but rewarding term and we have certainly got to know our 'new' Year 5s both in the classroom and on our recent residential. We are very pleased with how they've settled in and become Walton Priory children.

One of our key priorities this year is parental engagement with all aspects of school life. I'm pleased to say an average of 77% of parents attended the Parents' Evenings this term to discuss their child's progress.



We've also welcomed parents in KS2 to two meetings to explain how they can support their child at home-this has been followed up with maths workshops to share how we teach different parts of the maths curriculum. Other successful events for parents held just in the last week include the excellent Year 7 Science Fayre where children presented their investigations into questions such as "Is vegetarian dog food appetising to different breeds?" and "Are designer cosmetics really better than budget dupes? (I'm afraid the answer to the first one was no and to the second one was yes!). Our SEND coffee morning in December was also informative and sociable and included an input from the Autism Inclusion Team. Walton Priory children have benefited from a range of additional provision this term. This included presentations and talks in KS3 on different cultures and religions and a visit to the church in Y6 to celebrate festivals of light. 300 children attended the pantomime 'Beauty and the Beast' and were a credit to the school. They have also been busy raising money for charity via events such as Poppy Day and Children in Need. Our Christmas Jumper Day resulted in goods being donated to food banks. Rehearsals are in full swing for our production of "Alice The Musical" and we look forward to an entertaining performance of this fantastic show in the summer term.





Safeguarding Update

Get to know Age Ratings

Age ratings are in place to help protect your child, so we thought we'd provide you with a little reminder of how important it is to check the age ratings of what your child is accessing online. Here are the age ratings of some of the more popular apps that young people are accessing. Did you know that WhatsApp has an age rating of 16?



Whether your child is viewing films, accessing apps, playing games online, using social media or downloading other apps – check the age rating first to see if your child is old enough. In addition, the likes of PEGI include further content descriptors, which will give you an indication of the type of content that your child might view e.g. violence if accessing the app/game etc.

It is important to note that whilst age ratings do allow you to see if something may be appropriate for your child, it is also important to review the content yourself. This will allow you to make an informed decision as to whether it is suitable for your child to access and if it would be beneficial to apply further parental controls.
