Bosworth Battlefield

In May, we took all of Year 7 to Bosworth
Battlefield. This is the site of the battle between
Richard III and Henry Tudor, which ended the
Plantagenet Dynasty and brough in Tudor rule.
Our pupils had been learning about this as part
of our unit on the Wars of the Roses.

Pupils and staff had an excellent and educational day. We had a tour of the site and re-enacted (safely) the key parts of the battle; we studied artefacts found by archaeologists at

the site, we toured the visitor centre and museum, and we even worked out how Richard died by examining his wounds and the weapons used.

Pupils impressed teachers and Bosworth staff with their knowledge and behaviour. Well done Year 7.

PE DEPARTMENT


It's been a busy and brilliant term in PE!


